## 1. NEON PIGEON

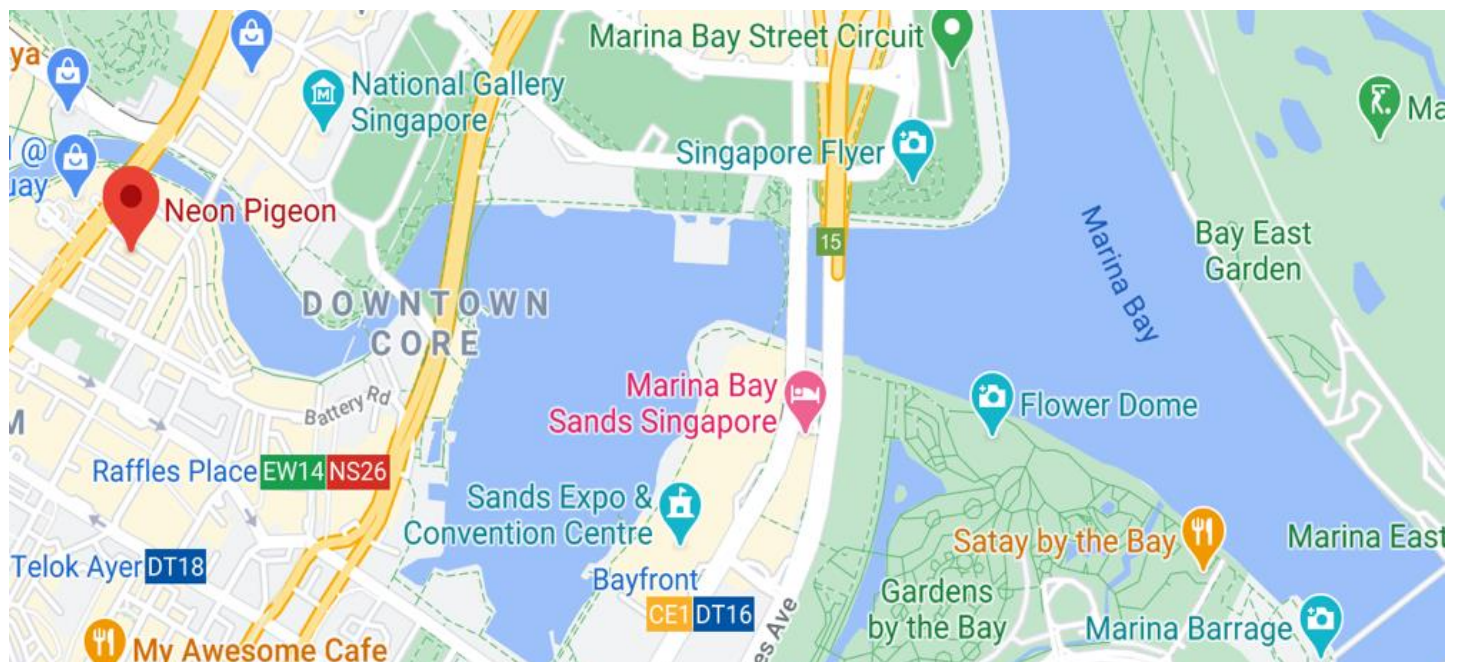
### Project Overview

Neon Pigeon 2.0 at Carpenter Street is a revamp of an existing restaurant in Singapore, which closed down and reopened in a new location on Carpenter Street. Modeled on a modern Japanese izakaya, the designers' vision was to recreate the urban atmosphere evoked in the first venue, while building on it by adding new layers and elevating the design. The new venue, which comprises 2 bars, is housed in a modern building with 4.8m high ceilings and is much larger than the previous venue. The Rebar bar, made of recycled rebar from Singapore construction sites, stands as the centerpiece of the room, and divides the room into zones; while the Back Bar, features vertical shelves made out of oxidized perforated metal and concealed light to create a beacon, the glow of which can be seen from outside.

Neon Pigeon is located in Carpenter Street in Singapore's lively Boat Quay District.





From the exterior, guests are greeted with a glowing Back Bar adorned with colorful liquor bottles and a suspended “Neon Pigeon” sign in Japanese text, made with many small bulbs.





Graffiti is a key design element of Neon Pigeon, highlighted on three walls throughout the establishment.





The Back Bar features vertical shelves made out of oxidized perforated metal and concealed light to create a beacon, the glow of which can be seen from outside.
