## 1. 1 HOTEL HAITANG BAY, SANYA

### Project Overview

1 Haitang Bay is the first resort in China from luxury brand US-based 1 Hotels. The 294-room sits in a prime location on Hainan island's beautiful shoreline. The eco-conscious architecture, designed by Oval Partnership, combines locally sourced natural materials, such as lava stone and red cedar, with innovative green technologies in order to minimize the hotel's footprint. Paying homage to the tropical flora and fauna of Sanya's forests and the crystal-clear waters of the ocean, Singapore-based design studio FARM was responsible for the interior design.

### Location map




The hotel is situated in a prime location on the south coast of Hainan Island.













The hotel's dining and drinking venues feature reclaimed timber and steel from old fishing boats and authentic textured surfaces.











Guestrooms feature unpolished and locally sourced volcanic basalt stone and wood throughout and an abundance of natural furnishings: stools made of tree stumps, live-edge timber desks, rattan rugs, bespoke artworks made from sun-bleached driftwood, and organic cotton upholstery.
