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1. PERIDOT

Project Overview

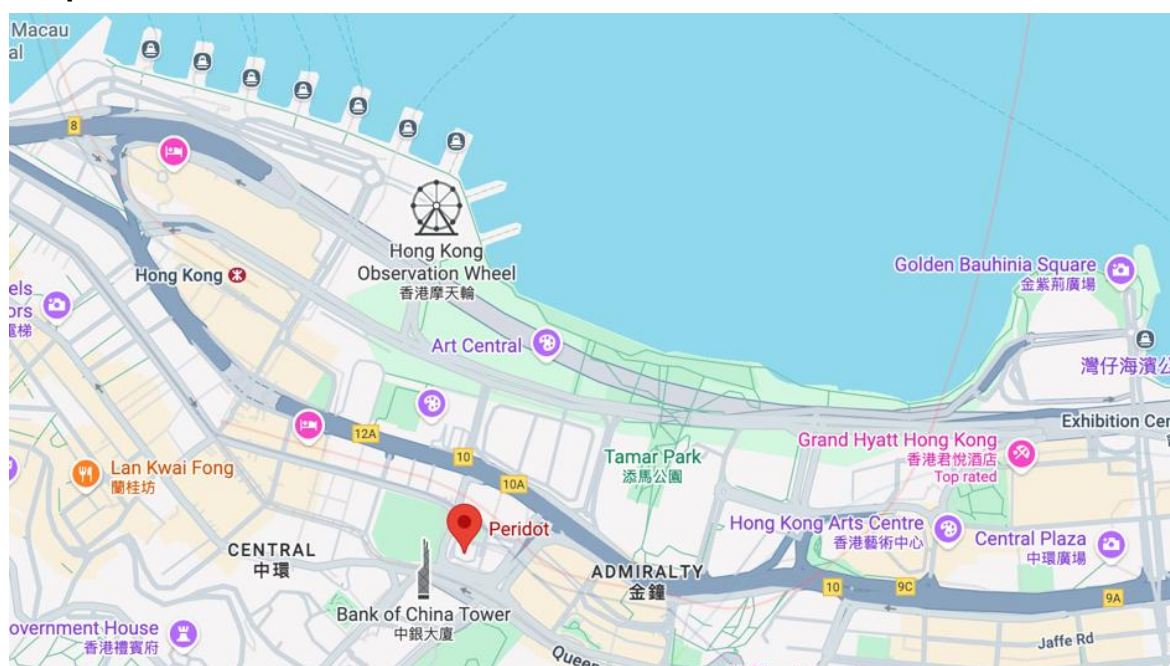
Peridot is a cocktail bar and plant-based dining venue located on the 38th floor of The Henderson in Central, Hong Kong. The building, designed by Zaha Hadid Architects, features a sculptural glass façade and houses Peridot within its upper levels. The bar was designed by Studio Paolo Ferrari and forms part of the broader development by Henderson Land Development.

The interior design is based on light, refraction and immersion. Continuous green-toned plaster surfaces wrap the space, flowing seamlessly from wall to ceiling to create a cocoon-like atmosphere. Frosted acrylic elements, mirrored surfaces, and integrated lighting add a layered, prismatic effect inspired by a shattered disco ball. Sculptural furniture and curved architectural forms echo the geometry of the building itself. The overall color palette draws from peridot, a transparent yellow-green gemstone variety of olivine, a green rock-forming mineral that also gives the venue its name.

Peridot is located on the top floors of The Henderson, a 36-storey office skyscraper in Hong Kong's central business district. The building exterior is defined by a sculptural glass façade inspired by the buds of the Hong Kong orchid, creating a curved, petal-like exterior made up of thousands of uniquely shaped glass panels.

The color palette of the interior is based on peridot, a transparent yellow-green variety of the mineral olivine, which is also the origin of the venue's name.



The venue sits high above the city, offering panoramic views of Hong Kong's skyline.



The interior features continuous green-toned plaster surfaces that wrap the walls and ceiling, creating a cocoon-like space.



The lime-green bar is illuminated with over 20,000 small lights.





Designed by Studio Paolo Ferrari, the interior is conceived as an immersive environment shaped by light and reflection.





Sculptural furniture and curved forms echo the geometry of the surrounding architecture.
