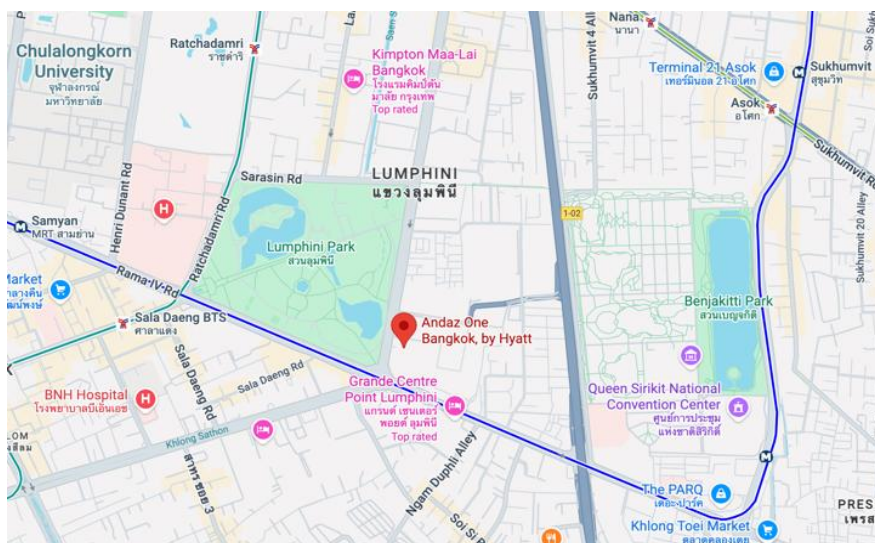
Project Overview

Andaz One Bangkok is the first Andaz hotel in Bangkok and part of One Bangkok, a large-scale mixed-use district on Wireless Road. Developed as Thailand's largest privately funded development, One Bangkok combines premium offices, luxury hotels, residences, retail, dining, art, culture and extensive public spaces within one integrated urban destination. Located next to Lumpini Park, the 244-room hotel is shaped by its surroundings, with views of Bangkok's skyline and connections to the adjacent greenery. The design concept is based on the idea of a "vertical neighborhood". Instead of a typical high-rise hotel layout, the interiors are organized as a sequence of interconnected spaces inspired by Bangkok's streets, shophouses, narrow sois [alleys] and mid-century architecture. Warm materials, wood tones, stone surfaces and soft lighting create a residential atmosphere, while indoor and semi-outdoor areas provide a sense of openness. Public spaces feature artwork by Thai women artists and installations using local materials and craft techniques. Designed by Thai studio PIA Interior Company, with architecture by A49, the hotel reflects a wider trend in hospitality design toward creating a stronger connection to local identity and context.

The hotel is located on Wireless Road next to Lumpini Park.



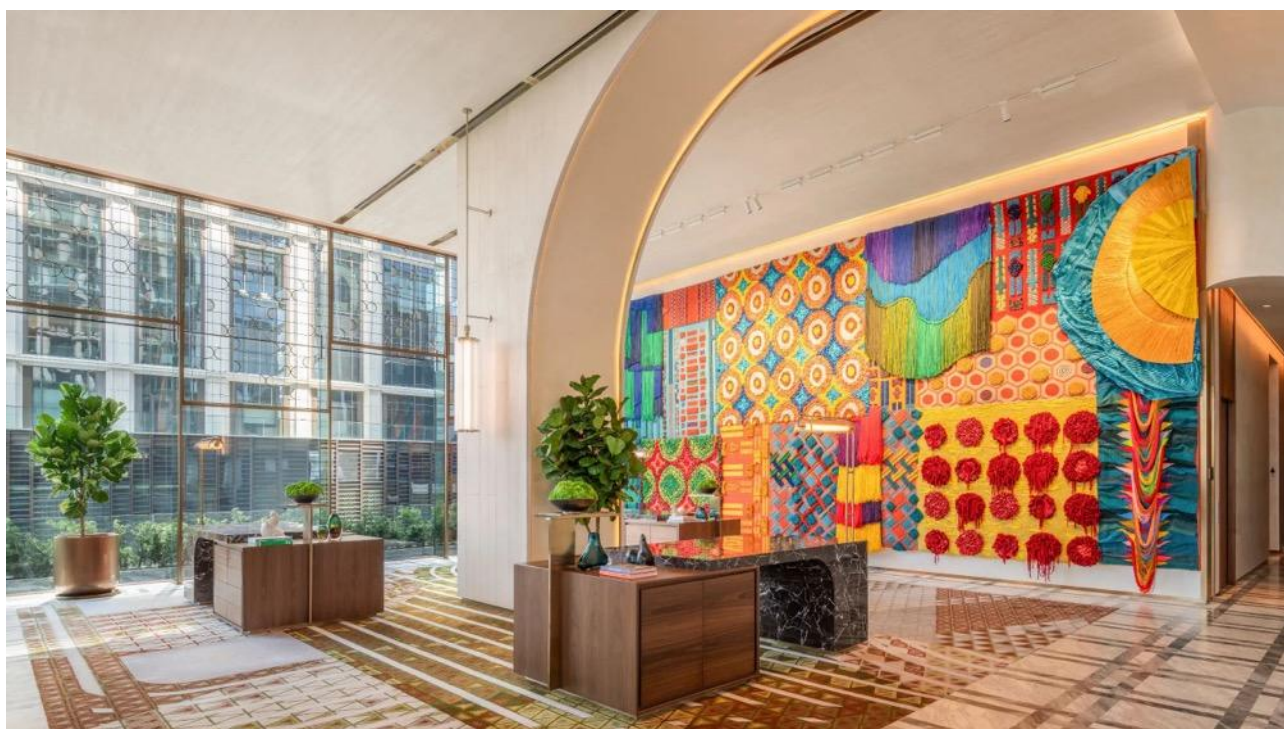
The design of the hotel is shaped by the contrast between Bangkok's dense urban environment and its green surroundings, with interiors emphasizing openness, natural materials and park views.





Curved forms, arches and material details reference Thai mid-century modern architecture, including influences from nearby historic buildings such as Vidy Palace.





The lobby features *Blockwilt*, a large-scale textile installation by artist Ploenchan "Mook" Vinyaratn, created from upcycled textiles and handwoven materials and inspired by the streetscape of Bangkok's Wireless Road.



The dining room combines warm materials, soft lighting and contemporary details, with views toward Bangkok's skyline and Lumpini Park.





The circular bar creates a central social space within the restaurant, combining curved forms, warm materials and a contemporary interpretation of traditional Chinese design elements.



The elevator landing uses a warm mix of materials, combining light oak wall panels with bronze-toned metal details around the elevator doors. The floor changes from polished marble or terrazzo at the elevator entrance to a patterned rug with a palm-frond design in burnt orange and grey tones, adding warmth and character to the space.



Guestrooms feature contemporary interiors with rounded forms, mid-century modern influences and views of Lumpini Park.
